


SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



NEW HOLLAND-MIDDLETOWN ESD #88 OPENS FOR IN PERSON INSTRUCTION




OFFICER PHARIS GAVE SAFETY PRESENTATIONS












TEACHING AND LEARNING DURING A PANDEMIC

Staff and students at NHM have embraced the new norms which include wearing face masks and practicing social distancing. Although we can all agree the start of the school year has been anything but predictable, we have settled into our new routines quite nicely. As grades and attendance are among the accountability methods returning to school this year, teachers are working on Priority Standards from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). These standards support teachers to engage in meaningful learning as we focus on the most foundational knowledge and skills for all students. Additionally, teachers have been trained on Remote Learning Practices to support all learners. We are taking the lessons we learned from March and determining ways to better reach our students to teach not only the core academics, but deriving ways to meet students' social emotional needs. Teachers are able to video chat with students using Flipgrid and Google Classroom. Each teacher has office hours every day so parents and students may contact their teacher to gain a better understanding of lessons and homework. The most important of these office hours is for students and teachers to be able to have meaningful contact with one another even if it is in a remote atmosphere.
